Caring for our environment is an increasing priority for our business. As such, customers are requested to recycle as much as possible and dispose of waste products and materials responsibly, reducing the amount of waste that goes to landfill.

WEEE (Waste Electricals and Electronics)

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) is taken back free of charge on a one-for-one, like-for-like basis. Waste batteries including rechargeable batteries are taken back free of charge. You are not obliged to make any purchase when returning old batteries. Each local authority must also accept household WEEE and small batteries free of charge at its recycling facilities. All WEEE and waste batteries must be recycled and should not be placed in any of your household wheelie bins. Make sure you always recycle all your old electrical goods and batteries.

How are we helping?

In the UK, distributors including retailers must provide a system which allows all customers buying electrical equipment, the opportunity to recycle their old items free of charge. As a responsible retailer, Hamleys have met the requirements placed on us, by financially supporting the national network of WEEE Recycling Centres. This is achieved through our membership of the Veolia Producer Compliance Scheme and Veolia National Distributor Take Back Scheme. Our Producer Registration Number is WEE/FH0133ZR.
